Calgary launches wind-power rail system

Windmill electricity purchased through provincewide grid

CALGARY — There are no propellers or wings, but Calgary's light-rail transit system is now officially the first public transit system in North America powered by the wind.

A variety of government and private-sector officials gathered at the Stampede LRT station this week to announce the beginning of an agreement where Calgary Transit will buy power for its C-Trains from a company that generates electricity from windmills near Pincher Creek.

But transit service in Calgary won't actually depend on wind blowing through the Crownsnest Pass. The electricity generated by the windmills will go into a power pool, to be sold on the open market, just like that from coal and natural gas-burning plants. Enmax, the city-owned electric company, will then sell the equivalent amount of electricity to Calgary Transit for the C-Trains.

The "Ride the Wind" program could actually wind up costing Calgary Transit an extra \$2.5 million over the 10-year contract if electricity prices stay relatively low, according to Theresa Howland, a product manager with Enmax. If prices move higher, however, the cost will be about the same, she said.

The actual cost per kilowatt hour is a contractual secret. Calgary Transit expects to spend about \$1.9 million this year on electricity for the C-Train.

Fred Gallagher, the managing director of Vision Quest Windelectric Inc. which owns the windmills, hopes this deal will lead to a renaissance of public transit in North America as more municipalities follow Calgary's lead.

At this week's news conference, Alderman Bob Hawkesworth was given the honour of driving an LRT car the length of the platform — an official acknowledgement of the fact he pushed the idea from the beginning.

After the 30-40 metre trip, a grinning Mr. Hawkesworth stepped off the train saying he was thrilled his concept was now a reality.

"I think this is the future," he said. "We have to be much more stewardly about our use of energy."

Calgary Transit general manager John Hubbell said the 21,000 megawatt hours of electricity generated for the C-Trains by the windmills will keep 26,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere annually. That, however, is only a tiny fraction of the 200 million-plus tonnes of CO2 Alberta's cars, factories and homes create every year — about a third of Canada's total output, according to Allan Arney, president of Climate Change Central.

About three-quarters of Alberta's electricity comes from coal-burning power plants, and another 15 per cent from natural gas-burning plants. Virtually all the rest comes from hydro-electric dams with just one per cent from alternative sources like windmills.

Overcrowding means solitary for prisoner awaiting trial

MILLBROOK, Ont. — A man awaiting his day in court on assault charges complained Friday of being kept in a segregation cell at Millbrook Correctional Centre because of overcrowding at the eastern Ontario jail.

Remanded in custody until his court appearance tomorrow, Russell Reid said he has been "in the hole" at the maximum-security facility for seven days, locked up 24 hours a day.

"I have rights as a prisoner," Mr. Reid said by telephone. "If they don't have room, they should get me the hell out of here to another institution."

The Millbrook jail, southwest of Peterborough, has been overcrowded since the Peterborough Jail was closed by a riot in late June, Mr. Reid said.

A spokeswoman for the Corrections Ministry said the Millbrook jail, which can hold up to 400 prisoners, is full and segregation beds are occasionally used for remanded prisoners.

"It is not the norm or preferred, but from time to time it may happen only for a day or two," said Julia Noonan.

She said remanded prisoners are normally locked down for 12 hours a day.

"We would not leave a remanded prisoner in segregation for seven days because there were no other beds," she said. Ms. Noonan said contingency plans for overcrowding are in place, including moving inmates to other institutions. She added the situation is monitored daily.
